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Health inequalities in Scotland: An independent review

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- Improving the nation's health and reducing health inequalities is a core area of focus for the Health Foundation's work and the Healthy Lives strategy.
- The aim of the work is to produce a high-quality review of health and health inequalities in Scotland that creates impact and legacy.
- The work will provide a robust evidence base for future policy development and delivery to improve people's long-term health and reduce health inequalities
- We are basing the work in Scotland through funded research and engagement activity.
- The review will run until the end of the year with a Health Foundation final report.
