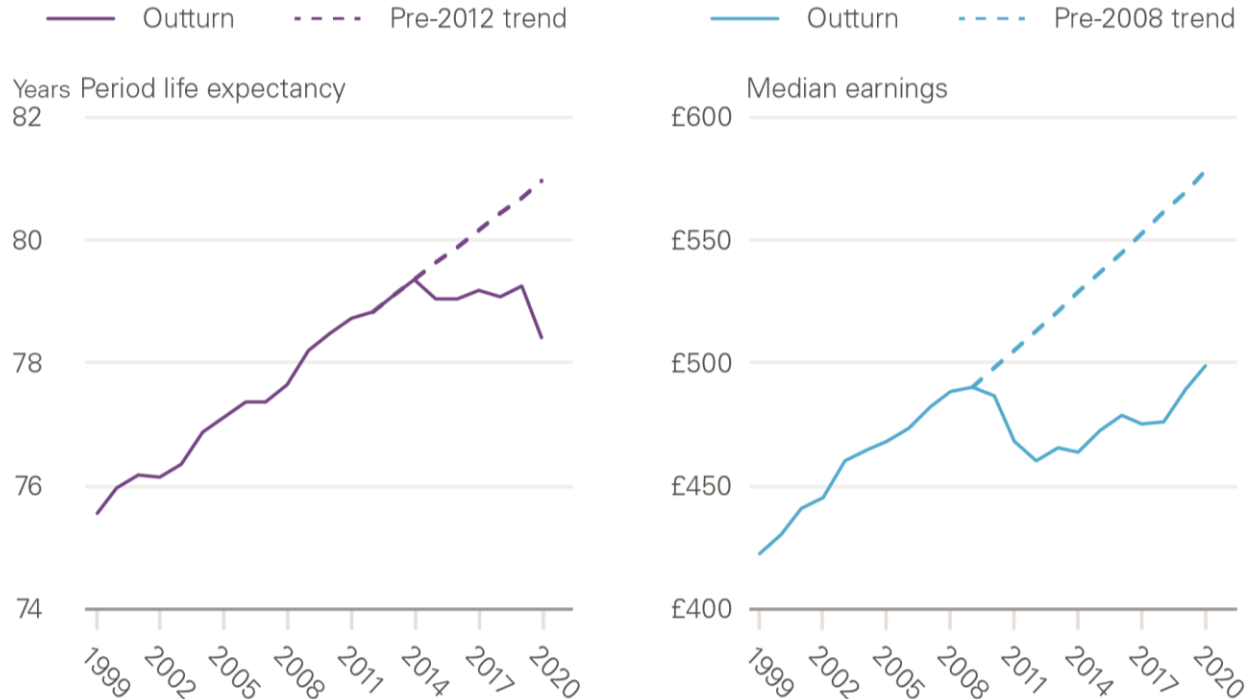

A decade of improving health & living standards followed by stagnation

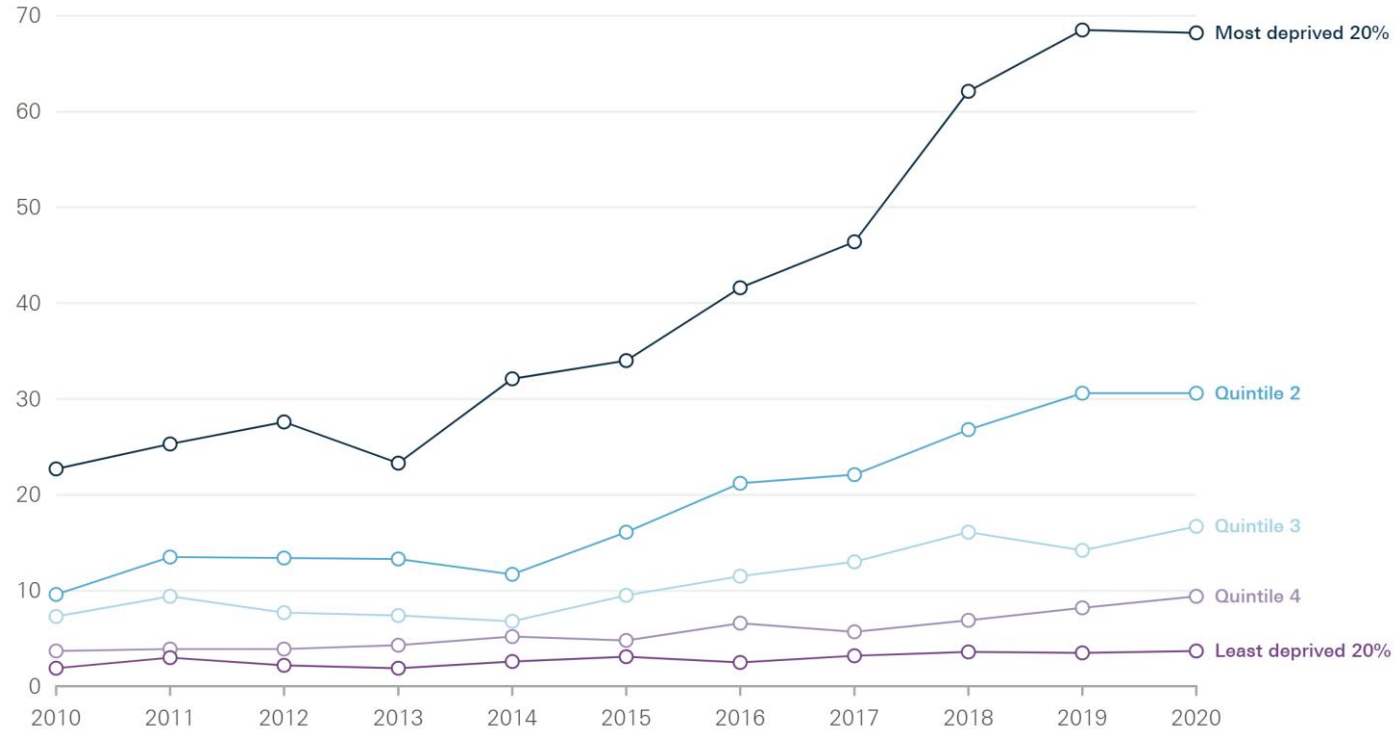
Period life expectancy and real typical pay growth: Scotland, 1999–2020

There has been a stark rise in drug deaths in the most deprived areas

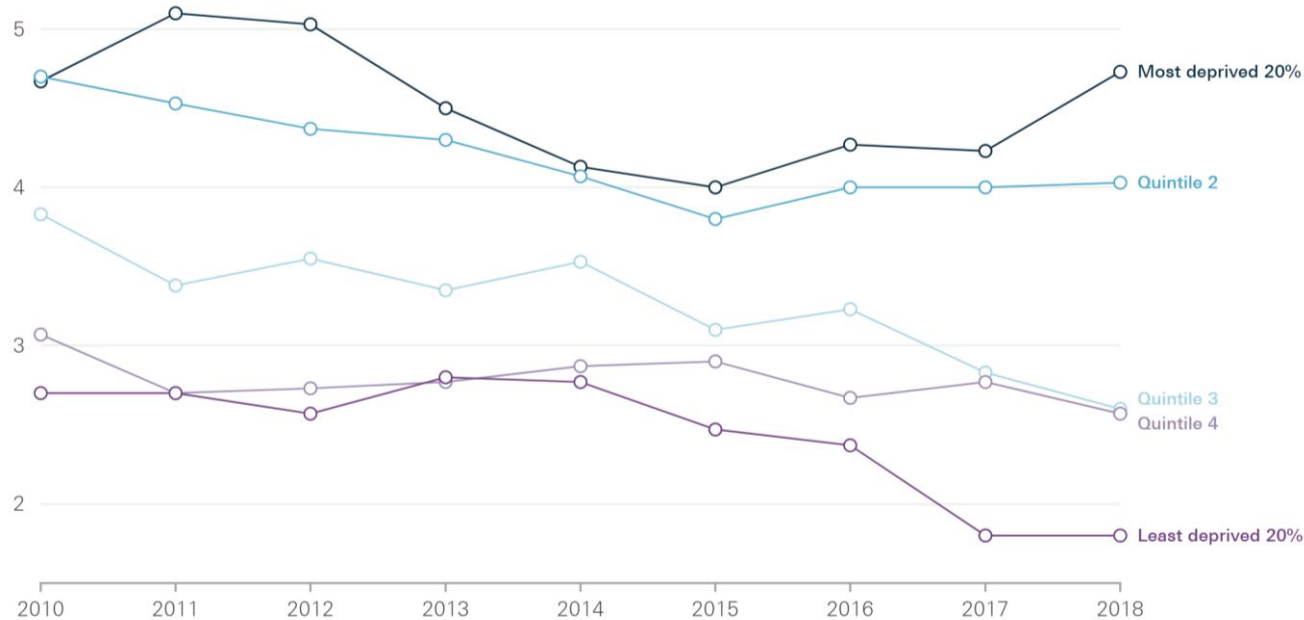
Drug deaths per 100,000 population: Scotland, 2010–2020

Infant mortality has started rising in the most deprived areas, falling or remaining flat for the rest

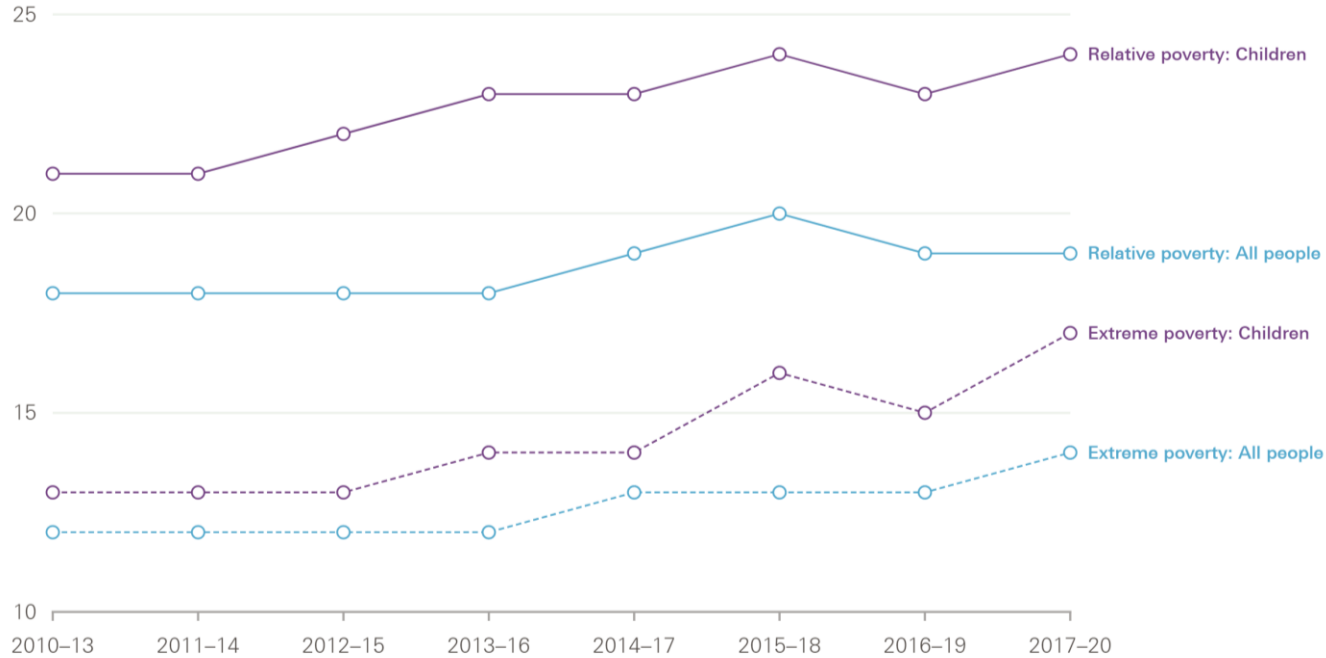
Infant mortality, per 1,000 live births: Scotland, 2010–2020

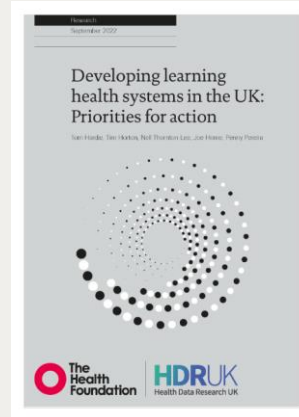
